"Black drivers were also searched at twice the rate of white drivers, though — as in other jurisdictions — searches of white drivers were more likely to turn up contraband." (Balko, R. 2019, April 10)

Second quote- "A 2017 study of interactions between officers and citizens taken from footage captured by police officer body cameras found that "officers speak with consistently less respect toward black versus white community members, even after controlling for the race of the officer, the severity of the infraction, the location of the stop, and the outcome of the stop." Third quote- "A 2016 study found that in Louisiana, killers of white victims were *14 times* more likely to be executed than killers of black victims. Black men who killed white women were 30 times more likely to get the death penalty than black men who killed black men. Those convicted of killing white people were also less likely to have their sentences overturned on appeal, and Louisiana hasn't executed a white person for killing a black person since 1752."
